Legislative News...

Suspension of COAH's Non-Residential Development Impact Fee

As you know, the New Jersey Economic Stimulus Act of 2009 suspends COAH's 2.5% Non-Residential Development Fee Act. Therefore, proof of payment of the fee, or proof of a qualified exemption of the fee is no longer required for the issuance of a final certificate of occupancy. For those contractors that have paid а non-residential development fee since July 17, 2008, you may claim a refund of monies paid. Bills Signed

Governor Corzine recently signed dozens of bills into law. Three new laws BCANJ monitored that may impact the construction industry are listed below.

<u>S-2888</u> / <u>A-4045</u> (Vitale, Schaer, Watson-Coleman) Appropriates funds to DEP for environmental infrastructure projects.

S-702 / A-1629 (B. Smith, McKeon, Prieto, Stender) Authorizes State enhancement of Uniform Construction Code's energy subcode based on anticipated energy savings; provides down payment assistance to certain purchasers of homes meeting enhanced subcode energy requirements.

<u>S-1437</u> / <u>A-1351</u> (T. Kean, Weinberg, Scalera, Voss) Requires training program for and recognizes position of technical assistant to construction code official.

Labor News...

Unemployment plagues the state and the industry

Initial unemployment claims rose in the first week of August, with New Jersey listed among the top 10 states, according to the US Department of Labor. Construction employment fell in July in 34 states, but remained relatively the same for New Jersey after June's steep decline.

PLA rule still undetermined for federal projects

The comment period for the Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR) council's proposed rule on the use of PLAs expired August 13, but as of this printing the council was considering an extension. The rule would implement President Obama's executive order to "consider requiring the use of project agreements" labor for federal construction projects that total more than \$25 million.
