BCA of Atlantic County Presents Safety Awards to Seven Members

Egg Harbor Township, NJ – In a special presentation sponsored by the Building Contractors Association of Atlantic County (BCAAC) and the Building Contractors Association of South Jersey (BCASJ), the Associations conferred their highest safety award to one member firm that completed 2008 without losing a single workday due to an accident. Three firms finished the year with “lost workday incidence rates” below the national average for the construction industry, and three others received Safety Recognition Awards.

The contractor firms were honored for their safety excellence on May 14, 2009, at the Venice Plaza in Berlin.

“Safety in construction is a top priority for our members,,” said Robert Polisano, President of BCA of Atlantic County. “These awards demonstrate our members’ efforts to foster a culture of safety on the jobsite.”
