BCANJ Awards Four Scholarships Totaling \$10,000

Edison, NJ – Four area students received college scholarships totaling \$10,000 from Building Contractors Association of New Jersey (BCANJ). Awarded through BCANJ's 12th Annual Presidents' Scholarship Program, the scholarships were presented at an awards ceremony and luncheon on June 22, 2010, at Mayfair Farms in West Orange.

The 2010 scholarship recipients were selected from nearly 20 qualified applicants. Each recipient will receive a one-time award of \$2,500 for attending an accredited college or university to help cover the cost of tuition, books, educational supplies, fees, and room-and-board. Established to assist employees of BCANJ active member firms with their children's and grandchildren's higher education needs, the program has committed \$279,000 in scholarships to 42 deserving individuals since its inception in 1999.

"For more than a decade, the Presidents' Scholarship Fund has allowed us to both recognize and support extraordinary students," said BCANJ Executive Director Darlene Regina. "These four recipients exemplify the best of this country's educational system, combining a remarkable drive for academic achievement with an admirable record of community service."
