2012 Membership Meeting

On March 27, 2012, BCANJ hosted a Membership Meeting at the Doubletree Hotel in Tinton Falls/Eatontown. The approximately 70 members and guests in attendance heard Michael Chrobak, Chief Economic Development Director of ChooseNJ, discuss the goals and recent successes of the privately funded, not-for-profit organization. Established to properly transmit the message that New Jersey has the kind of climate in which businesses can grow and prosper, ChooseNJ is governed by 16 business and civic leaders focused on lowering business taxes, reducing red tape, controlling healthcare costs and promoting the strengths of the state to a global business market. Chrobak pointed to ChooseNJ's success in 2011 of attracting or retaining 82 businesses, and acknowledged the state's strongest competition comes from neighboring states.

Coffee Talk with NJ Turnpike Authority

On March 28, 2012, BCANJ hosted a Coffee Talk with Richard Raczynski, Chief Engineer of the New Jersey Turnpike Authority, along with Rob Fischer and John Keller of his staff. The

team outlined the Authority's plan to spend \$350 million over the next five years in capital improvements involving vertical buildings, including 55 rehabilitation and 30 new projects. First up are four new state trooper barracks, estimated at \$10 million each, expected to be bid sometime this year. In the meantime, the Turnpike Authority is seeking a Project Management firm to oversee several, if not all, of the projects.

Laborers Merger

Effective March 12, 2012, the Local Unions consolidated to form two Building Laborer Local Unions in the state. Each Local has a business manager, several business agents and a dispatcher. NJ Special School Election Results

As we announced in Bulletin #29-12, voters approved only one of five proposed construction projects in the schools referendum on March 13, 2012. Of the \$24.5 million requested, just \$1 million was approved (4%) for a project in Little Silver, Monmouth County. None of the proposed

projects were to receive state aid. The next date on which a school board may schedule a bond referendum question is Tuesday, April 17, 2012.
