BCANJ Summer Program Puts 11 Students To Work In Construction Firms

Edison, NJ – As students head back to college this month, 11 of them leave behind a summer filled with work in their chosen career – construction. The students were all interns through the Student Summer Work Program sponsored by Building Contractors Association of New Jersey (BCANJ), which placed them in 10 member contractor firms in New Jersey.

Because of the economy, the number of construction projects in the state dramatically decreased this year, but the students were able to work on jobsites from Voorhees to Newark Airport, Princeton to Rutgers. When they completed their 12-week program, the students returned to school with a \$2,000 educational scholarship and a \$1,500 personal grant, a helpful financial boost in a tough recession. Jose Franco, a senior at Fairleigh Dickinson University in Teaneck, was offered a full-time position at his construction firm employer, Wetlands, Inc., of River Edge.

Most of the students are enrolled at the New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT) in Newark, which partnered with BCANJ more than a quarter-century ago to develop the program. Along with Jose Franco, two other students attend Fairleigh Dickinson University, and one attends Rowan University in Glassboro. All are pursuing degrees in construction management and engineering. As part of the summer program, the students participated in a mandatory OSHA 30-Hour Construction Safety & Health Outreach Program. They all maintain at least a 2.5 grade point average and have successfully completed a lengthy roster of construction-related courses that includes mathematics, physics, structural design, surveying and the environment.

"These students bring strong coursework knowledge to the task," said BCANJ Executive Director Darlene Regina. "Over the course of the summer, they gain valuable practical experience, guided by the best construction professionals in New Jersey. Regardless of economic downturns, our members recognize the importance of passing on their knowledge to the next generation. And because of the recession, we're particularly pleased our members could sponsor nearly a dozen students this year."
