# Update: Northern NJ District Council of Ironworkers

The Northern New Jersey District Council of Ironworkers' agreement expired on June 30, 2011. A new agreement has not yet been reached; however, negotiations are ongoing. The union continues to work under the existing wage and fringe benefit schedule. The next meeting is scheduled for September 8, 2011.

# Operating Engineers, Local No. 825 Small Works Agreement

In Bulletin #78-11, we announced the expansion of the Operating Engineers, Local 825's Private Commercial and Industrial Agreement to include contract values of \$5 million or under where there is documented non-union competition. # Moratorium on 2.5% COAH Fee Signed Into Law

As we announced in Bulletin #84-11, on August 24, 2011, Acting Governor Kim Guadagno signed legislation into law that provides relief from COAH's onerous 2.5% fee. BCANJ, along with our labor partners and the commercial developer community, strongly advocated for a solution to COAH'S 2.5% non-residential impact fee since its re-imposition in July of last year. The newly signed law places a twoyear moratorium on the 2.5% nonresidential impact fee, and restores the moratorium retroactively to July of 2010. # Environmental Infrastructure Bills Signed

In Bulletin #80-11, we told you Governor Christie signed into law several BCANJ-supported legislative measures that have the potential to enhance water quality and create infrastructure projects. ## Port Authority Approves Toll and Fare Increase

On August 19, 2011, the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey approved a multi-phase toll and fare increase to finance the Authority's 10year capital plan. In response to comments provided by both New York Governor Cuomo and New Jersey Governor Christie, the final approved increase was substantially reduced from the Authority's initial proposal. The total amount of the capital plan is billion, approximately \$25 protects several high-profile projects, including the George Washington Bridge Cable, the Lincoln Tunnel Helix, the Bayonne Bridge, Goethals Bridge and the World Trade Center.

## July Construction Employment Improves

As we posted in Hot Topics on the BCANJ website, the construction industry nationwide in July added 8,000 net jobs, the highest number in 15 months. Contributing to the growth were the nonresidential building and specialty trade segments of the industry, which added a total of 10,200 jobs in July, primarily in factory, power plant and hospital projects. The unemployment rate also dropped to 13.6% in July, down 3.5 percentage points from July of last year and sharply down from two months ago, indicating that many construction workers have left the industry to seek work elsewhere.

#### Criminal Immigrant Deportation Reached All-Time High in 2010

The US deported nearly 393,000 illegal immigrants in the last fiscal

year (which ended September 30, 2010), and half were considered criminals. Under the "criminal" designation, 27,635 deportees were arrested for drunk-driving offenses, while another 13,028 were arrested for less-serious traffic law violations. However, most of the criminals deported - 45,003 - were charged with drug-related crimes, up from 36,053 in 2008. Secretary of Homeland Security Janet Napolitano noted that because the most serious offenders are serving prison terms, we haven't yet seen them reflected in the deportation numbers.
