## Carpenters Blended Rate Update

As you know, the New Jersey Regional Council of Carpenters adopted a "Blended Rate Program" for the purpose of preserving or expanding market share on certain construction projects in New Jersey. Examples of some of these projects include wood and metal framed restaurants, hotels, professional and medical offices, small renovation projects, tenant fit-out projects and mixed-use projects that involve both commercial and residential work.

Addendum An to the current Collective Bargaining Agreement has been executed that will evaluate, on a project-to-project basis, the use of a reduced blended rate achieved by commingling carpenters of different rates to achieve the blended rate established for that particular job. The New Jersey Regional Council of Carpenters developed procedures for evaluating applicability of the Blended Rate.

#### Governor Christie Outlines Potential Solutions for UI-Fund

As you know from Bulletin #24-10, Governor Christie has proposed the suspension of an automatic employer payroll tax increase of as much as \$683 per employee that would be used to fund NJ's insolvent Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund. # Federal funding for UI modernization

To date, New Jersey is one of 22 states with "full-share" approval to receive a slice of the \$7 billion special funding distribution for unemployment insurance modernization. Part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, the monies may be used to pay unemployment compensation benefits with no obligation to repay the federal government. New Jersey's share is more than \$2 billion, of which \$1.28 billion has been drawn down for Emergency Unemployment Compensation and \$36.1 million for Extended Benefits.

# DHS reports big drop in illegal immigrant count

As of a year ago, nearly 10.8 million illegal immigrants lived in the US. That number was 800,000 fewer than January 2008, according to the Department of Homeland Security. From 2007 to 2009, the illegal immigrant population dropped by about 1 million, a figure DHS considers "coincident with the US economic downturn." The declining numbers are in contrast with the first six years of the decade, when the illegal immigrant population grew by 3.3 million to a peak of 11.8 million.
