Labor/Legislative Briefing

On May 25, 2011, BCANJ hosted "Labor & Legislative Briefing: How You Will Do Business in the Future," at the Association office in Edison. Michael Capelli, Executive Secretary-Treasurer of the Northeast Regional Council of Carpenters, told the group of the events that transpired in the merger of the New Jersey and Empire State Regional Councils and the benefits of the merger for contractors. Joseph McNamara, Director, New Jersey Laborers'-Employers' Cooperation and Education Trust (NJ LECET), described efforts to promote and create union construction projects.

BCANJ CEO Jack Kocsis and staff outlined the current status of collective bargaining agreements, wage and benefit changes, market recovery agreements and the market study the Association commissioned with the support of labor partners. The program wrapped up with a discussion about BCANJ's PAC processes and outlook on primary and general NJ legislative elections this year.

New Jersey Special School Election Results

The details of the latest round of New Jersey School Construction Referendum results from Wednesday, April 27, 2011, are included with Bulletin #52-11, accessible online to members at <u>www.bcanj.com</u>. Voters approved school construction projects in five out of eight districts, for a total of \$20.8 million (41% of the proposed \$50.8 million). Just over \$2.2 million (one project) is eligible for state aid. The next scheduled referendum is Tuesday, September 27, 2011.

Legislative Priorities Advance

As we detailed in Bulletin #58-11, BCANJ's legislative priorities continue to advance in the NJ legislature. A-2769 / S-2552, which limits the naming of subcontractors at the time of bid, is heading to the full Senate for a floor vote. A-3285 requires certain public contract bid advertisements to contain certified cost estimates or estimate ranges of projected contract costs and specifies grounds for rejection of all bids. This bill now heads to the full Assembly for a floor vote. For more information, access the bulletin online at www.bcanj.com.

State Database for Public Bidding Opportunities

In May, Governor Christie signed into law S-2065, which creates "Bulletin-NJ," a searchable Internet database to provide up-to-date information on State government procurement opportunities. The information will be organized primarily by the name of the contracting unit publishing the project listings. The database is expected to be launched by March 1, 2012. "No-Match" Letters Resume

On April 6, 2011, the Social Security Administration once again began "Decentralized sending Correspondence" letters, also called "no-match" letters notifying employees and employers of discrepancies in information reported on W-2 forms from that found in Social Security records. A courtordered halt to the letters prevented Social Security from sending them during 2007, 2008 and 2009, but now

New Obligations Proposed for Federal Contractors Hiring Veterans

In April, BCANJ hosted an AGC of America webinar on affirmative action laws for federal contractors as regulated by the Office of Federal Contractor Compliance Programs. Later last month. the OFCCP published proposed regulations that would increase contractor obligations for hiring veterans. In short. contractors with a contract valued at \$100,000 or more would have to track the veteran status of applicants, maintain a database on veteran referrals, calculate veteran applicants against total applicants, establish goals for hiring veterans and keep records of employment decisions.
