NJ Special School Election Results

As we announced in Bulletin #92-11, voters in the New Jersey School Construction Referendum on Tuesday, September 27, 2011, approved school construction projects for only two out of six projects in five districts, for a total of just over \$53.66 million. However, the total represents about 75% of the amount requested (\$71.2 million), with two bigticket items approved in Gloucester County. Just over \$14.9 million is eligible for state-reimbursed aid. The last bond referendum this year is scheduled for December 13, 2011. COBRA Subsidy Ends

As we reported in Bulletin #87-11, the subsidies that allowed employees terminated during the recession to pay lower COBRA premiums came to an end on August 31, 2011. The bulletin also contained an FAQ and Fact Sheet from the US Department of Labor and can be accessed on the "Members Only" section of the BCANJ website.

Government Affairs...

American Jobs Act

As we told you in Bulletin #89-11, on September 8, 2011, President Obama proposed a \$447 billion plan to create jobs and boost the economy. The biggest slice of the proposed plan is an estimated \$175 billion in tax cuts to encourage corporate investment in business expansion, capital improvements, personnel and equipment. Much of the rest of the proposal concentrates on construction jobs, with \$50 billion slated for immediate road, rail and airport construction and another \$30 billion to be put toward modernizing 35,000 public schools across the country. The President also asked Congress to lower both employer and individual payroll tax rates to 3.1% next year, and sign off on corporate tax breaks for investment in new equipment. A week later, President Obama detailed his deficit-reduction plan to present funding streams that balance his aggressive jobs plan. Discussion on funding for the plan has been derailed by debate on disaster relief for states and the US government's overall funding challenges. BCANJ will monitor and track the plan's movement through Congress this fall.

NJ Senate Advances "Job-Creating" Bills

Senate Democrats and Republicans, committed to getting the state's economy moving again, voted on several pieces of legislation in September that have the potential to spur job creation and assist businesses in expanding in our State. The following bills received bipartisan support and have cleared the full Senate. S-3033 (Lesniak, Kyrillos), would establish the "Grow NJ Assistance Program," a tax credit incentive program designed to grow NJ-based companies through subsidies for both new and retained jobs. S-3052 (Whelan, Sarlo) would establish a business loan program in EDA allowing certain businesses to be eligible for low-interest rate loans of up to \$250,000 to expand their businesses in NJ. S-3054 (Sweeney) would expand certain corporation business tax credit programs to include the gross income tax, providing gross income taxpayers with the same incentives available to corporation business taxpayers for investment and hiring, particularly sole proprietors, partnerships, and limited liability companies. The Assembly will take up these initiatives during the lameduck session this coming fall.

Federal 3% Withholding

A new federal law will require federal, state and local governments to withhold 3% from all payments for goods and services as a guard against tax evasion. The implementation date is scheduled to take effect on January 1, 2012. The withholding percentage will be applied when a federal, state or local government has annual expenditures exceeding \$100 million. These aggregate expenditures are not limited to just construction contracts. President Obama's "American Jobs Act" pushes the implementation

date back through 2013. However, according to AGC of America, there are several bills making their way through Congress that would outright repeal the new tax. BCANJ has had constructive dialogue on this issue with various members of NJ's Congressional Delegation in support of AGC of America's efforts. The bill(s) will see action in Congress during the upcoming fall session.
