BCANJ Summer Work Program Sponsors 11 Students In Contractor Firms

Edison, NJ – Eleven area students were placed by the Building Contractors Association of New Jersey (BCANJ) as summer interns in ten construction contractor firms in New Jersey. The students, who attend colleges in New Jersey and Pennsylvania, experienced first-hand many of the office and jobsite tasks that comprise the daily life of a contractor. Their contractor employers are all members of the BCANJ.

Upon completing their 12-week program, the students returned to school this month with a \$1,500 educational scholarship and a \$1,500 personal grant, tangible support to complement the invaluable knowledge and experience they gained on-the-job. They are enrolled in construction management and engineering programs at the New Jersey Institute of Technology in Newark, which partnered with BCANJ nearly 25 years ago to start the program, as well as at Drexel University in Philadelphia, Villanova University in Villanova, PA, and Stevens Institute of Technology in Hoboken.

To qualify for the program, the students participated in a mandatory, BCANJ-sponsored OSHA 30-Hour Construction Safety & Health Outreach Program at the BCANJ office in Edison. In addition, they have maintained at least a 2.5 grade point average and have successfully completed a lengthy roster of constructionrelated courses that includes, among other topics, mathematics, physics, structural design, surveying and the environment.

"Our contractor members open their doors every summer to students who are interested in pursuing careers in construction management," said BCANJ Executive Director Darlene Regina. "The program allows contractors to personally train a potential new employee, while giving the students an excellent opportunity to put their classroom training to work on real construction projects. Many of the students return to the same contractor when they graduate."

Member companies who hosted students this summer included Bergen Engineering Co., East Rutherford; Berkowsky and Associates, Cranbury; Epic Management, Inc., Piscataway; Ingrassia Construction Co., Inc., Middlesex; Joseph A. Natoli Construction Corp., Pine Brook; Edward Leske Co., Union; March Associates, Wayne; J.R. Prisco Inc., Summit; Stanker & Galetto, Vineland; and Turner Construction, Somerset.

Established in 1937, the Edison-based Building Contractors Association of New Jersey (BCANJ) is made up of some 225 active and associate members who are engaged in commercial, institutional and industrial construction.
