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BCANJ PRESENTS SAFETY AWARDS TO 19 CONTRACTOR MEMBERS

Edison, NJ - In a special presentation before the combined membership of the Building Contractors Association of New Jersey (BCANJ) and the Construction Roundtable of New Jersey (CRTNJ), BCANJ conferred its highest safety award to 17 member firms that completed 2007 without losing a single workday due to an accident. Two more firms finished the year with "lost workday incidence rates" below the national average for the construction industry.

The contractor firms were honored for their safety excellence at the BCANJ's 19th Annual Safety Awards Program on March 18th at the Hilton Gardens Inn in Edison, attended by more than 100 BCANJ and CRTNJ members. During the past 19 years, the Association has presented more than 350 safety awards to its member firms in recognition of their commitment to safety and excellence in the workplace.

"Safety in construction continues to remain a top priority for our members and our labor partners," said Jack Kocsis Jr., Chief Executive Officer of BCANJ. "We are pleased to recognize so many of our members for their commitment to safety on the jobsite."
