BCANJ Summer Work Program Sponsors 23 Students In Contractor Firms

Edison, NJ – More than 20 area students were placed by the Building Contractors Association of New Jersey (BCANJ) as summer interns in 17 construction contractor firms in New Jersey. The students, who the majority of attend colleges in New Jersey and Pennsylvania, experienced first-hand many of the office and jobsite tasks that comprise the daily life of a contractor. Their contractor employers are all members of the BCANJ.

Upon completing their 12-week program, the students returned to school this month with a \$2,000 educational scholarship and a \$1,500 personal grant, tangible support to complement the invaluable knowledge and experience they gained on-the-job. They are enrolled in construction management and engineering programs at the New Jersey Institute of Technology in Newark, which partnered with BCANJ 25 years ago to start the program, as well as at The College of New Jersey in Ewing, Drexel University in Philadelphia, Duke University in Durham, NC, Fairleigh Dickinson University in Teaneck, Notre Dame University in South Bend, IN, Pennsylvania College of Technology in Williamsport, PA, and Rutgers University in New Brunswick.

To qualify for the program, the students participated in a mandatory, BCANJ-sponsored OSHA 30-Hour Construction Safety & Health Outreach Program at the BCANJ office in Edison. In addition, they have maintained at least a 2.5 grade point average and have successfully completed a lengthy roster of construction-related courses that includes, among other topics, mathematics, physics, structural design, surveying and the environment.

"As interns, these students are mentored by the best construction professionals in the state," said BCANJ Executive Director Darlene Regina. "Many of the students return to their summer employers after graduation, and in turn become mentors for new interns in the program. That continuing cycle has remained strong for more than a quarter-century."
